FEMA UPDATE SPECIFIC TO THE JASPER BUILDING

Two years and three months of dedication to the FEMA process in every effort to be sure that our students, faculty, staff, and community receive fair and compassionate relief from the flooding caused by Tropical Storm Fred has resulted in a decision delivered by FEMA and reviewed in detail by the district's appointed architect and construction manager. On behalf of the Board of Education and the District Office, I am announcing that FEMA has determined that the district is eligible for fully funded repair of the current Jasper building. Mitigation (flood-proofing) of the building will also be funded.

All stakeholders can take pride in the work that has taken place since August 18, 2021 to leave no stone unturned regarding FEMA's 50% Rule calculation to determine repair vs. replacement. The attention to detail and unwavering efforts to go the extra mile in documenting damages for the calculation show the district's respect for our students, parents, employees, and community in addition to an unquestionable amount of Wildcat Pride and undeniable love for Jasper-Troupsburg.

The next step is an on-site meeting in Jasper with the FEMA Mitigation Specialists on December 4th. During the meeting, flood-proofing options will be outlined. The FEMA project will not be finalized in the FEMA portal until the mitigation plan has been approved and costed. On December 4th, we will also be meeting with Bernard P. Donegan, Inc. to discuss the process and timeline for bringing the FEMA funded project to the voters, submitting it for NYSED approval, and beginning construction to repair the building.

Topping the list of things that I am forever grateful for is the support and understanding of the Wildcat Community since the flood. Students, families and employees have made sacrifices in one way or another; but in spite of it all, incredible things continued to happen. I also am especially appreciative of the unbelievable amount of extra work done by Lou Zver, Alexis Devine, and Kate Ross to get us to this point, as well as the work that will be done by this team as we move forward.

Finally, we continue to be thankful for support shown by the Canisteo-Greenwood Central School District through the use of the Greenwood building. We will keep loving it like our own until we are back home.




HIGH SCHOOL NEWS




