
Wow! What a month we have had at the elementary school.

HIGH SCHOOL NURSE'S OFFICE

Students entering 7th grade are required to have one Meningitis vaccine. Students entering 12th grade are required to have two Meningitis vaccines unless their first was received on or after their 16th birthday. Notices will be sent home with students that need to have the vaccine. Proof of vaccination needs to be received prior to the start of school in September 2023.

Students between the ages of 14-17 who plan to work this Summer will need a working permit. If you already have a job lined up, or are hoping to get one, please stop in the Health Office to get an application so it can be completed prior to Summer break.

Students planning to play Fall sports will need a physical on file that has been completed in 8/2022 or after. Any student needing a physical will receive a notice. Students may have their physical completed by their family doctor or the school physician will be available to complete physicals at the Greenwood building on August 11th. If you choose to have the physical done by the school physician, you must contact Barb Leach, School Nurse to schedule an appointment time.

We had three students chosen as Wildwood Student of the Month:


Karley – Cosmetology


Garrett - Criminal Justice
