FEMA UPDATES

As of this publication, the district is still waiting for FEMA's final calculations in the 50% determination that will dictate if the Jasper building is eligible for full replacement or if the building will be restored. Either outcome would be at the site of the current Jasper building, as FEMA has informed the district that they will not be directing a relocation of the building. On behalf of the Jasper-Troupsburg Board of Education and our amazing faculty and staff, I am honored and so excited to welcome our students and families to the 2023-2024 school year.

The summer has been packed full of preparing for the 180 days of awesomeness that will begin on September 6th, with a focus on student engagement and achievement. Professional development in Kagan structures, Professional Learning Communities, Leader in Me, and science investigations lends evidence to the district-wide belief that learning is a lifelong process for adults and students alike. Building Leadership Teams and the District Leadership Team have worked throughout the summer to develop specific, measurable goals that show our commitment to meeting the needs of every student at Jasper-Troupsburg. These goals will be showcased at the October Board of Education meeting.

Attendance will be a primary focus in the upcoming school year, as our chronic absenteeism rates have been increasing. All stakeholders can help in this area. We are asking families to avoid scheduling trips and vacations during days when school is in session, as daily attendance is one of the largest factors in student success. While students who are ill certainly need to stay home, healthy children should be at school. Each month we will provide updates on overall attendance rates in a shared effort to attack this concern. For a starting reference point, it is important to note that in the 2022-2023 school year, 13.4% of students were chronically absent at the Elementary level and 24.2% of students were chronically absent at the Jr/Sr High School level.

Another district-wide initiative is centered around increasing community involvement. Please be on the lookout for opportunities to participate in the development of our strategic plan, volunteer or share your expertise, and lend your voice to discussions that will continue to build upon the greatness of our schools.

Enjoy the remaining days of summer, and please remember that I am always available for questions or conversations through email or by calling the district office.

Students are encouraged to get breakfast and lunch daily from the cafeteria where a number of options will be available daily. Please be aware that supply chain challenges still exist and menus are subject to change.

While all students are automatically eligible for free breakfast and lunch, families are still encouraged to complete the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Application. Knowing exactly how many families could benefit from free/reduced lunch helps JTCSD in many ways and enables us to extend as many benefits as possible to eligible families. Lastly, anybody interested in joining the cafeteria team as a substitute food service helper is encouraged to submit an application to the district!
